**Assuring Better Child Health
and Development II (ABCD II)/
Illinois Healthy Beginnings**

Surveys indicate that parents want their child's health care provider to address child development and psycho/social issues. Early detection and referral is crucial to addressing developmental, emotional and behavioral problems. Families who receive these types of services have enhanced trust in, and a more successful working relationship with, their physician and are more satisfied with their care. New strategies and tools are available to help health care providers meet these demands!

The Advocate Health Care Healthy Steps Program, the Illinois Academy of Family Physicians (IAFP), the Illinois Chapter of the American Academy of Pediatrics (ICAAP), the Ounce of Prevention Fund, and the Illinois Department of Healthcare and Family Services (formerly the Illinois Department of Public Aid), among others, have partnered to offer developmentally oriented continuing medical education (CME) opportunities to pediatricians and family physicians.

Training is divided into 3 components: developmental screening, social/emotional development, and maternal depression. It will be held on-site in medical offices, clinics and hospitals, and is geared towards the entire staff in order to facilitate a comprehensive team approach to patient care. In addition to CME credits, we offer resource materials and the opportunity for additional training and technical assistance.

- The developmental screening module will help physicians and their staff select and administer screening tools for developmental delays; use improved parent/caregiver education materials and resources; and learn about efficient office procedures related to developmental screening and referrals.*
- The social/emotional module will focus on the importance of relationships in a child's life, "red flags" to developmental delays, and instruction on how to complete the Ages and Stages Social/Emotional Questionnaire (ASQ S/E).*
- The maternal depression module will focus on risk factors for maternal depression; effects of depression on the mother-child relationship; the differences between "normal" baby blues and true post-partum depression; and administration of the Edinburgh Post Natal Depression Scale (EPDS).*

*These programs will also provide information regarding when (and to whom) to refer a mother and/or child if there are concerns with their development or social/emotional health and well-being. In addition, information will be included regarding billing procedures for the use of screening tools.

To further enhance providers' and their staffs' knowledge of key child development issues, participating practices can request additional training, technical assistance, educational materials, and consultation on such topics as:

Autism Detection and Referral
Child Temperament and Parenting
Discipline/Limit Setting
Sleep and Sleep Disorders

Childhood Feeding Difficulties
Teachable Moments the First Three Years
Literacy Promotion
