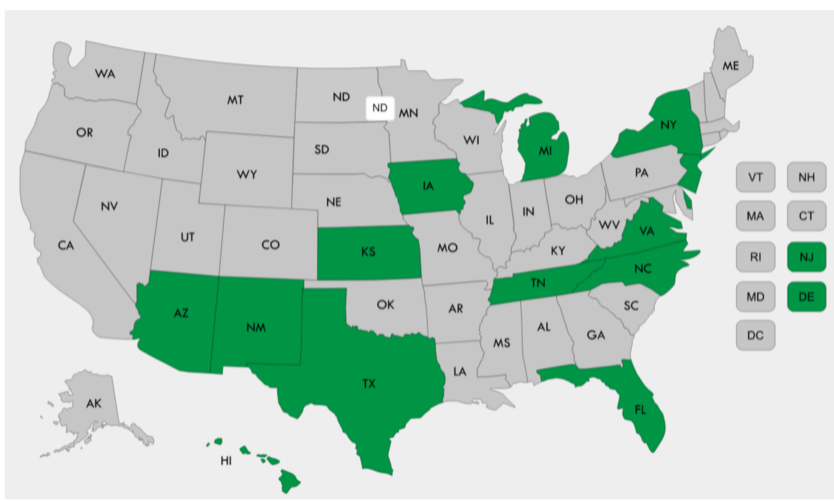

Vermont Takes Next Step to Import Rx Drugs from Canada

The Vermont Agency for Human Services has presented its [report](#) detailing next steps for wholesale importation of prescription drugs from Canada, which was approved by Vermont’s legislature last year. NASHP, with assistance from consultants and funding from the Laura and John Arnold Foundation, assisted with the report that conservatively predicted significant savings could result from importation. Based on calculations from two of the state’s three major insurance carriers and factoring in costs from just 17 drugs, savings of \$1 to 5 million annually are expected.

As health care delivery systems rapidly transform, states are redesigning their long-term services and supports (LTSS) and integrating them into Medicaid managed care programs for children. This map features states that provide LTSS to children through Medicaid managed care programs and details key elements of their LTSS structures and systems.



Oklahoma Medicaid Advances Alternative Payment Models to Control Rx Prices

Oklahoma’s state Medicaid agency is the first in the country to use innovative alternative payment models through contracts negotiated with drug manufacturers that link supplemental rebates to outcomes, such as medication adherence and reduced hospitalizations.
